Approximately 20 percent of all [children and youth in the U.S. have chronic and complex needs](#), including physical, mental, and behavioral health conditions. These children have greater needs and require more specialized care than children without special needs, yet [they experience significant challenges to accessing quality care](#) and many do not receive the care and services needed. Families of children with chronic and complex needs [experience a higher cost burden and greater financial challenges](#) (e.g., difficulty paying medical bills, reduced employment, missed time from work) to accessing care than other families due to their increased use of health services. When children with chronic and complex needs are not able to access timely care, [they can experience adverse health outcomes](#).
