

**Volunteer Work, Informal Learning and Social Action** Fiona Duguid, Karsten Mündel, Daniel Schugurensky, 2013-06-12 Since most research on work focuses on paid work and most literature on education concentrates on schools it is not surprising that studies on the relations between work and learning emphasize the relations between paid employment and organized education This unique book deals with an area that has been rarely covered in the literature on work and education the connections between volunteer work and informal learning Through a variety of examples ranging from the Red Cross to teacher labourers from cooperatives to social housing and from participatory democracy to environmental social movements this volume examines the learning dimension of volunteer work in different contexts It also considers the special case of volunteerism among recent immigrants The case studies analyze three basic types of voluntary organizations those providing social services representing local communities and mobilizing for social change The chapters include profiles of the actual work their members do and detailed accounts of the learning practices they are engaged in during their work and the impact of such learning on their personal and professional development The concluding chapter offers a comparative analysis practical recommendations and steps for further research *Climate Justice and Collective Action* Angela Kallhoff, 2021-05-20 This book develops a theory of climate cooperation designed for concerted action which emphasises the role and function of collectives in achieving shared climate goals In debates on climate change action research focuses on three major goals on mitigation on adaptation and on transformation Even though these goals are accepted concerted action is still difficult to realize *Climate Justice and Collective Action* provides an analysis of why this is the case and develops a theory of climate cooperation designed to overcome the existing roadblocks Angela Kallhoff starts with a thorough analysis of failures of collective action in the context of climate change action Taking inspiration from theories of water cooperation she then establishes a theory of joint action that reframes climate goals as shared goals and highlights the importance of adhering to principles of fairness This also includes an exploration of the normative claims working in the background of climate cooperation Finally Kallhoff puts forward proposals for a fair allocation of duties to cooperate with respect to climate goals This book will be of great interest to students and scholars of climate action climate justice environmental sociology and environmental philosophy and ethics more broadly **Reforming Lesson Study in Japan** Yuta Suzuki, 2022-03-30 This book elucidates the formation and development of theories of action in school reforms for Schools as Learning Communities SLC during ten years from its inception in 1998 in select Japanese elementary schools junior high schools and one secondary school While growing international interest in Japanese lesson study is in pursuit of a standard lesson study Suzuki offers a unique perspective into school reforms for SLC and how they resisted the standardization of lesson study out of concerns that it would limit a teacher's autonomous judgment and choice Through a theory of action approach in its examination of the pilot schools for SLC this book clarifies Why did teachers reform lesson
