

World History 2nd Semester Exam

You should be familiar with the following:

Medieval Europe:

Characteristics of feudalism - small independent cities with hierarchies of knights and kings.

Estate(or fief) - Hierarchy of people in each city. King owns land and give some land to lord. Lord makes army and give king money for food. Lord give some land to lesser lord. Lesser lord give money to lord and king for food. Serf and peasants. Serfs work for Lesser Lord(vassal)/Lord/King (can't leave ever)

Guilds in Medieval Europe - Little groups of a knight(or knights) and their pages etc. Each guild lives together and has their own set of rules/lifestyles.

Features of Castles - moat(water or ditch around a castle); drawbridge(bridge at the entrance that could be put up as defense mechanism); Great hall(big area where lots of things happen: school, banquets, events, etc.); Bailey(courtyard area with open grass and/or garden); portcullis(strong heavy grating that can be lowered down to block people from entering or exiting).

Trebuchet - threw things like how a catapult does. Very big and was made to destroy castle walls.

Mangonel - smaller than trebuchet and threw smaller items but was easier to use.

Conditions of Medieval towns - small and compact; dirty; gross; smelly; no heating or cooling. Peasants and people that worked for the king(or lord) and could not leave.

Renaissance:

Humanism - cultural movement that moved from the medieval customs back to the ancient Greek and Roman custom of life and thought.

Sistine Chapel - paintings are by Michelangelo and known for his frescoes that display parts of the bible.

Mona Lisa - Painted by Da Vinci. Her facial features make people question where she's actually looking.

Sir Thomas More - the author of the book "Utopia"

American Civil War(1861-1865), American(1765-1783) & French Revolution(1789-1799):

American Revolution

Albany Plan of the Union - Plan made by Benjamin Franklin to unify the government in each colony to form one government.

Sugar Act - made special courts to hear smuggling cases (only a judge, no jury)

Stamp Act - tax on all printed material, taxed without consent

Declaratory Act - parliament had the right to tax and make decisions for the colonies in all cases whatsoever
