## Causes - before 1517

## The Response to Luther - 1521

## Anne Boleyn -1533-1536

She was the Queen of England from 1533-1536. She married Henry VIII and gave birth to a girl but Henry VIII wanted an heir to the throne, not a girl. Henry VIII gave up and beheaded Anne. Henry did the same with 5 other wives and none of them ended up producing an heir.



## John Knox 1689

John Knox was a writer, scottish minister and theologian. He worked with John Calvin to create the Presbyterian denomination. Although, it took 120 years for it to be well know.



## Martin Luther - 1517

Martin Luther is a very important person for the Reformation. He spoke out against the indulgences of the Catholic church and pinned his 95 theses to a door of his Catholic Church.



## Henry VIII - 1509-1547

Henry VIII was the King of England from 1509-1547. He wanted to divorce his wife because she couldn't produce an heir to the throne. He didn't care and set a precedent to divorce and not be scared of the Pope.
